2. One Steer may qualify from each selected show; if the standard is insufficient no steer may be chosen.
3. All animals must be led by a competent adult

2. One Heifer may qualify from each selected show; if the standard is insufficient no heifer may be chosen.
3. All animals must be led by a competent adult.
4. These rule should be read in conjunction with the Irish Shows Association Rules.

Class: 392 Non-thoroughbred Filly Foal, calculated to make a quality hunter or sport horse. Also a Qualifier for the A Browne Filly Foal All Ireland Championships. Final in Moate on 27.08.2011.

Rules and Conditions for Qualifier

1. Entries are confined to Filly Foals registered in the I.H.R with the breed code ISH or ID with the dam documented on the passport & must be sired by a stallion that is classified as 'Approved, 'Supplementary Approved' or 'Preliminary Approved' in the Irish Sport Horse Studbook or a Stallion that is classified as 'class 1' / R.I.D' in the Irish Draught Horse Studbook. The class is also open to the progeny of Weatherby's Thoroughbred Stallions that are not classified in the I.H.R".
2. One foal from selected shows may qualify, provided the judges and the I.S.A. agree the standard is high enough.
3. Foals must be led at all times.
4. Exhibitors to both the qualifier and the final must have the mare's passport and foal's I.D. Cert ready for inspection prior to entry to the judging ring. Failure to comply with this rule will lead to immediate disqualification.
5. Where a foal is produced by an embryo transfer method, the dam's passport must bear a declaration dated, stamped and signed by the stallion owner and accredited practitioner. Where AI is used state the date on which the Dam was covered and the name of the stallion.
6. Animals qualified for Final are not eligible to enter any other class at Moate Show other than qualifying classes for other Finals
7. Those rules should be read in conjunction with the Irish Shows Association Rules

Rules and Conditions for Qualifier

1. This championship is confined to Irish Draught Two Year Old Fillies, the progeny of a registered Irish Draught Mare or appendix mare & a RID Stallion who have qualified at selected ISA Shows this season.
2. Each entry must have her passport available for checking by the I.S.A. Representative, both to the Qualifying Show and to the Final to confirm that she is eligible to compete. No filly will be allowed to compete unless her passport is in order.
3. Two Animals in each qualifying class may be selected to compete in the final provided the judges agree the standard is high enough.
4. One of the judges at the qualifying show must be from the Irish Draught Horse Judges List.
5. Animals qualified for Final are not eligible to enter any other class at the Show.

Class: 472 Cones/ Obstacle Speed Competition, will be run as a Top Score competition. Minimum vehicle track width of 125cm.

Sponsor: Digi Prints, Tullamore

Prizes: 1st — €80, 2nd — €50, 3rd — €30, 4th

1. In this competition, a certain number of obstacles/gates/pair of cones (referred to as gates hereafter) are set up in the arena.

Each gate carries from 10 to 100 points according to its difficulty.

2. The gates must be built so that they can be driven in both directions.

3. All competitors must carry a groom/passenger. The wearing of a properly fastened hard hat is strongly recommended. Vehicles may have pneumatic tyres and the use of a mechanical brake is permitted. No sulkies permitted.

4. The competitor is credited with the number of points carried by each gate that he has negotiated correctly. No points are awarded for a gate knocked down or where the balls on top of the cones have been dislodged.

5. Each competitor has up to 90 seconds. During this time, he* may negotiate all the gates he wishes in any order and in any direction. The start/finish must be crossed in the correct direction.

6. Ringing the bell declares the end of the round. The competitor must then cross the finishing line to allow his time to be recorded. If he does not cross the finishing line, he is placed last of the competitors with the same number of points. The finishing line will be provided with flags; a red and a white flag at each end of the line.

7. If the fixed time is reached at the moment when the turnout is already in but not completely cleared, this gate does not count.

8. Any gate knocked down during a round will not be rebuilt; if it is negotiated again, no points will be credited to the competitor. In the case of disobedience without a knockdown, the competitor may negotiate that gate or continue to the next gate.

Each gate may be negotiated twice. The act, voluntarily or not, of negotiating a gate for the third time or of passing between the flags of a gate already knocked down does not incur elimination. However, the competitor does not score the points allotted to this gate.

9. All disobediences are penalized by the time lost by the competitor.

10. The competitor must stop after a fall of horse groom or driver (fall of driver or groom defined as both feet on the ground). He will be eliminated.

11. The competitor who has obtained the highest number of points will be declared the winner. In the event of equality of points, the fastest time taken between the starting line and the finishing line will decide. In the event of equality of points and time for first place, there will be a negotiate-drive off according to the same formula with a fixed time of 40 seconds.
